Underground homes

A badger's home is called a SETT, a network of underground tunnels & chambers. They have several SETTS in their TERRITORY

Badgers in Britain live in groups known as CLANS, with an average of 5 to 6 adults

Each clan has a dominant BOAR (male) and dominant SOW (female). CUBS are born between December and February.



Social but not sociable
