BARK – one of the noises a badger makes as a warning

BEDDING – badgers collect bedding material (eg. hay, leaves), roll it into a bundle and drag it backwards into the sett.

BOAR – a male badger

CLAN – the word used to describe a group of badgers (sometimes a cete)

CUB – a young badger

DIG – this is what badgers do to make their setts

EARTHWORM – the main food of the badger

EURASIAN – the British badger is really called the Eurasian badger because it lives in Europe and Asia

FOX – the fox sometimes shares the badger's sett and is also active at night

GROOM – badgers like to scratch and groom their fur

HOLE – badger holes are usually 'D' shaped; flat side downwards; at least 20cms wide

LATRINE – a place where badgers dig small pits for their droppings

MELES – the Latin name for a 'British' badger is Meles Meles

NOCTURNAL – a word for animals which are active at night

OMNIVORE – a word for animal who eats both plant and animal material

OTTER – one of the badger's relations in the mammal world

PAW – the badger's large front paws are ideal for digging

PLAYFUL – badger cubs are very playful! They often play-fight and chase each other

RABBIT – rabbits live in badger setts too, even though badgers sometimes eat them!

SAND – badger setts are often in sandy soil

SETT – the place where badgers live

SMELL – a badger's sense of smell is 700-800 times better than ours!

SOW – a female badger

TERRITORY – each badger clan has its own area called a territory or a home range
